CAPC – Health Care Worker

SUMMARY:

This temporary full-time position is located in the North Bay office for a term of up to twelve (12) months. The CAPC Worker leverages community services in the delivery of a wide range of hands-on support services to young parents in the community with children ages 0-6 years, such as, individual and/or group programming and supports. With a focus on the social determinations of health, attachment, bonding, parent coaching and community partnerships, the CAPC worker helps young parents who are between the ages of 13-22 years of age to learn and understand a wide variety of approaches to raising healthy and safe children. All actions are performed according to regulations set out the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC), as well as the vision, mission, values and overall strategic direction of PARNIPCAS. This position is within the Bargaining Unit.

QUALIFICATIONS AND ASSETS:

- Bachelor of Science in Nursing.
- Current membership with the College of Nurses in Ontario.

- Satisfactory Police Records Check with Vulnerable Sectors Screening and Provincial Child Welfare Check.
- Bilingualism (English/French) is considered an asset.
