A Year of Transformation and Growth

The past year has been one of growth and innovation at The Children's Aid Society of the District of Nipissing and Parry Sound. As the pandemic faded in everyone's rear-view mirrors, we at no point lost sight of our collective focus, that of always striving to provide the best possible service to those we work with. There are many examples of innovation and growth demonstrated in the organization but we will today focus on a couple of key areas.

All levels of the organization immersed themselves embarking on the implementation stage of *Signs of Safety (SOS)*. The *SOS* model which is based on key principles of respect and inclusion demands ongoing engagement with children, youth, their families and their "networks" at all stages of planning. We are now beginning to see some of the benefits that have resulted from the significant time and energy required to successfully implement this model. We are hearing from some families that they are experiencing our involvement differently, that their interactions with us "feels different". Despite the increasing complexity in situations the staff have faced, they have always been committed to participating in countless meetings and sessions to ensure that the necessary shift in our practice occurs.

Another very exciting part of our growth, one we are very proud of is 140 Elmwood. Although we hoped to be in a different place regarding our one-site project, we did not allow that delay to abandon or even slow down our vision of offering a community space where children, youth and families can connect, learn and grow. We realized our goal of a partnership with VON, with the opening of the Nurse Practitioner's office which will ensure vulnerable individuals who cannot at this time access medical services in a consistent manner, do.

We are in yond grateful to Steven Beauchamp and family for their extremely generous donation to help support a redevelopment project of at will see a new community kitchen, a tech lab, a boardroom, a youth art studio, and a quiet lounge. We know that the intentional message of our agency's vision for this community space is being realized with community events that have taken place and with others that are planned for the future. 
It has been tremendously valuable being able to gather together at Elmwood. We can reconnect and rebuild relationships and trust with our fellow community partners.



CONNECTING YOUTH IN CARE WITH SUPPORTS TO SUCCEEDTO ADULTHOOD

The **Ready, Set, Go Program**, launched in April 2022 provides youth transitioning out of care (up to the age of 23) with the life skills, financial assistance and supports they need to pursue post-secondary education, skilled trades, training and employment opportunities.
