Improving Outcomes for Children in Foster Care

We are continuously working to strengthen the quality of our services, with a particular focus on modernizing the foster care system. Through our Child and Youth Worker program, we continuously refine and evolve our approach to better support families, ensuring that we meet their unique needs in meaningful ways. We know that children flourish when surrounded by familiar supports, which is why we prioritize placing them with kin and kith families. This approach not only strengthens family bonds but also provides a more stable and nurturing environment for the child.

To ensure the ongoing success of these initiatives, we've established two key working groups. The Better Outcomes Committee which focuses on identifying the best placement fit for each child, considering their individual needs and circumstances. Additionally, we have a recruitment-focused group dedicated to ensuring the right homes are available for youth. Together, these groups work in tandem to create a comprehensive and responsive foster care program.





GUIDED BY COMMUNITIES

We are deeply committed to supporting First Nations, Inuit, and Métis (FNIM) families through culturally grounded, respectful partnerships.

In our continued work with two First Nations communities, we recognize and honour their journey, ensuring our practices are shaped by cultural understanding, community direction, and shared accountability.

Our work is guided by meaningful collaboration, where we walk alongside communities, listening, learning, and adapting. This includes ensuring our staff receive ongoing cultural training, regularly reviewing and updating protocols to reflect community values and expectations, and sharing information in ways that are transparent, respectful, and rooted in trust.

By centering Indigenous voices and perspectives, we continue to build relationships that support the well-being of children, youth, and families in a way that honours their identity, history, and inherent rights.



Achieving Excellence with Modern Solutions

Innovation is one of our core values and a driving force behind how we grow, adapt, and continuously improve the way we serve children, youth, and families. It challenges us to think differently, embrace new possibilities, and stay ahead of emerging needs in an ever-changing world.



Being innovative also means staying responsive, listening closely to the voices of those we serve and finding new, meaningful ways to meet their needs. Elmwood is at the center of this progress.


